Does Your Chronos Clock Battery Need Replacing? - Revisited

In the May 2012 Newsletter I was interviewed about my experience with the Chronos clock and batteries. See:

http://www.metrowestchess.org/Community/History/News/2011-2020/2012/2012-05 Newsletter.pdf The article concluded with "Oh well, we'll just have to wait for the next battery change.", well, that time's arrived.

- 04-01- 02 game 0723
- 01-13- 07 games 0724 1189 (465 games since previous battery

change)

- 04-26- 12 games 1190 1664 (474 games since previous battery change)
- 11-29- 17 games 1665 2509 (855 games (529 not G/30) since previous battery change)

While I have almost doubled my games played since the last battery change, at least 326 (38%) of those games were at G/30 using another clock leaving about 529 at time controls and conditions similar to the earlier data.

Normally the LCD displays continue to fade until they become unreadable. This usually took at least 10 hours of running time, and generally longer before it would reach that point. This time around I was in the middle of a game and the clock reset to the pre-programmed setting! It was then that I noticed some fading has started but it was not readily noticeable. I thought, maybe my clock was now "unusable". I've had it for at least fifteen years and while the LCDs have never bled or died which I've seen on other Chronos clocks, maybe it's electronics have had it.

The next day I opened it up to change the batteries in the hope that the clock will still work and much to my pleasant surprise, one of the three batteries was corroded at one end. I cleaned up the contacts, put in new batteries and the LCD looks great.

Based on the data I've collected it may be more of a case of how long the batteries have been in the clock rather than the amount of games or run time. Still the game count is pretty consistent, 465, 474 and 529.

I'll get back to you with the next data point which is likely to be in 2022. In the meantime though, better check the newsletter each month till then to see if

there's a change in the pattern.

Note: You can change the batteries and not lose your settings.
